

JOB TITLE: Concrete Pump/Conveyor Truck Operator/Trainee

GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES: The Operator will be responsible for the operation of a concrete pump truck/line pump/conveyor truck. This includes driving to and from the jobsite, operation of the pump/conveyor, and keeping the equipment clean and in good operating condition. The operator is expected to be a good representative of the company and must have the ability to relate with customers in a professional, responsible manner. Due to the fact that this is a highly competitive business, the hours worked will be irregular with many last minute changes. An Operator has to be flexible to the needs of the company and its customers.

HELPFUL KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: A knowledge of concrete pumps/conveyor trucks, and some mechanical skills necessary to keeping the equipment in running order is required. Applicants must have a good driving record and good customer relation skills. Applicants must be able to read and comprehend equipment manuals, safety manuals, road maps and directions.

HELPFUL EDUCATION: A high school diploma or equivalent is required.

HELPFUL EXPERIENCE: Experience in operating concrete pumps/conveyor trucks, working with customers and completing all paperwork in a detailed and legible manner.

<u>CERTIFICATES/LICENSE REQUIREMENTS</u>: Commercial Drivers License, Medical Card, Drug Testing, A.C.P.A. Operator Certification Card (A CDL is not required for the operation of a trailer mounted line pump).

<u>SUPERVISION RECEIVED</u>: Reports directly to the Operation Managers, Dispatch and Owners.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS: The applicant must have the ability to run the equipment in a conscientious and safe manner, and be able to lift, set and move system. An applicant must have the ability to troubleshoot minor mechanical problems in order to keep the equipment in good condition.

Hearing and eyesight must test OK for normal communication on the job. The Operator must also be able to verbally communicate with others. An Operator needs to have the manual dexterity to climb on and around the equipment in all weather conditions common to this area of the country.

An Operator must be able to occasionally lift fifty (50) pounds from a squat to an overhead position and be able to occasionally push and pull up to one hundred (100) pounds. An Operator must possess the ability to stand for up to twelve (12) hours a day and have the balance and dexterity to walk around various jobsites.

An Operator must have a working cell phone with a functional voice mail to keep current on schedule changes.
